



1. Condition of Exhibition

Artist hereby agrees to exhibit the Works at the Exhibition only during the Term under the license specified in Exhibit 1 attached hereto in order to allow the visitors of the Exhibition ("Visitors") and to take photographs of the Works and distribute freely only for non-commercial purposes and without any modification on the condition that the Visitors shall attribute the name of the Artist in the distribution.

Ai Weiwei ("Artist") agrees to hold the exhibition titled Ai Weiwei: According to What? ("Exhibition") exhibiting 26 works ("Works") at Mori Art Museum ("Museum") from July 25, 2009 to November 8, 2009 ("Term").

1. Condition of Exhibition

Artist hereby agrees to exhibit the Works during the Exhibition under the license specified in Exhibit 1 attached hereto and, as a copyright holder, allows visitors ("Visitors") to take photographs of the Works and distribute those images freely but limited for non-commercial uses and without any modification of the images as well as on the condition that the Visitors shall attribute the name of the Artist in the distribution.

2. Notice and Restriction

Museum shall clearly state following terms and conditions and notify them to the Visitors;

- a) Visitors are allowed to take still photographs of the Works ("Photographs") only but not videos of the Works.
- b) Visitors are allowed to reproduce <u>Photographs</u> and publicly <u>distribute them over</u> // Internet for non-commercial purposes without any modification to the <u>images of</u> // the Works.
- c) In distributing the Photographs, Visitors shall attribute the Artists in the following manner:


